

Village President's Letter

What a great summer its been! I have really enjoyed seeing everyone experiencing the warmer weather and enjoying time with neighbors and friends. One of the most talked about subjects this summer has been the temporary closing of the Chapel Hill Bridge. The project reminded us all how much our community relies on the bridge every day. Although the closure made it difficult to travel throughout our community and created challenges for our businesses, the repairs were necessary and we can feel confident knowing that the bridge remains safe for travel. I would like to give a special thanks to the **McHenry County Division of Transportation** for working cooperatively with the Village on this project and keeping it on schedule. I would also like to thank all of our residents and businesses owners for the patience and support they exhibited throughout the project.

With the bridge now open, you have probably noted that traffic movement at the intersection of Fairview Avenue and Chapel Hill Road is restricted. Motorists can no longer make a left turn from Fairview onto Chapel Hill Road. The board established the regulation to address safety concerns and minimize the potential for accidents.

Memorial Day weekend in Johnsburg was extraordinarily special this year. In addition to the wonderful Memorial Day event hosted by the Johnsburg VFW Post #11496 each year, we also had the honor of hosting the Wall that Heals Vietnam War Memorial in our community thanks to the efforts of Township Supervisor Mr. Craig Adams and McHenry Township officials. Both events were well attended and provided an opportunity for our residents to pay tribute to those that have served and continue to serve our country. Many thanks to the Johnsburg VFW and to McHenry Township for their dedication to our service men and women. Annual Fall Brush Pickup

The Johnsburg Public Works Department will be conducting its annual fall brush pickup beginning **September 17th, 2018**. All brush must be placed by the road no later than 7:00 a.m. on Monday, the 17th of September. Crews will make one pass through each subdivision therefore any branches that are not placed by the road when they go by will not be picked up at a later time. **Branches should be a minimum** of 4 feet in length to be safely placed in the chipper and no greater than 6 inches in diameter. They must be placed with their cut ends pointed towards the road in a neat and orderly pile. Branches that cannot be put through the chipper safely will not be taken. Ev-



ergreen cuttings must be kept separate from other tree branches and will be picked up separately. This service is being provided for larger branches generated from trimming or storm damage and is not intended for disposal of whole trees that have been removed.

2018 Road Maintenance Program



The 2018 Road Maintenance Program is underway. Public Work's employees have been working throughout the community trimming trees, sweeping streets, filling in shoulder gravel and performing small road patch repairs. The Village solicited bids for road resurfacing and larger patching projects, which will be underway shortly. Roads in Dutch Creek Woodlands, Country Oaks and Prairie Com-

merce Center are included in this year's resurfacing program. Road patching will also be done in Lake Dawnwood and along major arterials throughout the Village. Please proceed with extra caution when traveling through work areas.

Maintaining our roadways is a high priority. Each year, roads are inspected to determine their overall condition and then rated to establish a maintenance schedule. By monitoring our infrastructure and establishing timely maintenance plans, we can manage maintenance costs effectively. This past year, the Village implemented a new rating system called PASER, which stands for the Pavement Surface Evaluation and Rating. The PASER system utilizes industry acceptable criteria to provide for better management of our road infrastructure. It incorporates a formal structure to address roads with emphasis on



safety, sustainability and ride-ability. The program serves as a great planning tool, which enables the Village to operate more efficiently and economically. Through the system we can track costs, maintain an accurate inventory and record historical data.

Back to School



Johnsburg District 12 and St. Johns the Baptist Catholic Schools will soon be back in session. Before long, the more leisurely days of summer will give way to academic and fall sports activities. While you are getting back into the school routine, we want to remind you of some back to school safe driving tips:

SLOW DOWN - It's never more important for drivers to slow down and pay attention than when kids are present – especially before and after school. We receive frequent calls about people driving through neighborhoods at excessive speeds. Typically, the driver resides in the subdivision. Slow down and be a good neighbor!

IF YOU'RE DROPPING OFF- Make sure you know the schools drop-off procedures. More children are hit by cars near schools than at any other location. Don't double park; it blocks visibility for other children and vehicles. Carpool, whenever possible, to reduce the number of vehicles at school.

PEDESTRIANS- Don't block the crosswalk when stopped at a red light or waiting to make a turn, forcing pedestrians to go around you; this could put them in the path of moving traffic. Stop and yield to pedestrians crossing a crosswalk or intersection. Take extra care to look out for children in school zones, near playgrounds and parks, and in all residential areas.

SHARING THE ROAD WITH SCHOOL BUSES - If you're driving behind a bus, allow a greater following distance than if you were driving behind a car. It will give you more time to stop once the yellow lights start flashing. It is illegal to pass a school bus that is stopped to load or unload children. If the yellow or red lights are flashing and the stop arm is extended, traffic must stop. The area 10 feet around a school bus is the most dangerous for children; stop far enough back to allow them space to safely enter and exit the bus.

CHILDREN OFTEN ARE UNPREDICTABLE, and they may not recognize potential hazards and take risks.

Fall Back: Home Preparedness Checklist for Time Change Sunday, November 4, 2018

Autumn is right around the corner and Time Change Sunday is on the way!

On the first Sunday in November, we come to the end of Daylight Saving Time. As you circle the house, resetting clocks, take time for this short safety checklist to make your home safer.

Change the clocks and the batteries. Smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors save lives ... if they're powered on by a fresh battery. Safety experts recommend replacing smoke and carbon monoxide detector batteries twice a year--so celebrate Time Change Sunday with fresh batteries all around. **Energy savings hint:** don't toss the replaced batteries just yet. While they're likely not fully charged, replaced batteries can still do duty in children's toys, media players or electronic devices. Squeeze the last drop of power out of them before you recycle!

Replace light bulbs. Long dark winter evenings call for a little illumination! Since you'll have stepladders out to reach smoke detectors and clocks, double up on safety (and energy savings) by checking for light bulbs and fixtures. Consider replacing conventional bulbs with energy-efficient compact fluorescent or LCD bulbs. The U.S. Environmental Protection estimates that replacing standard bulbs with energy-efficient ones saves over \$30 in electricity costs over their lifetime.

Prepare for cold and flu season. With the cooler weather comes colds and flu. Check your medicine cabinet and assess stocks of over-the-counter medications. Make sure you have sufficient non-aspirin fever reducers, cough syrup, and decongestants needed to fight colds or flu. In the pantry, a stockpile of canned soup and lemon-lime soda can ease cold symptoms and fight off dehydration--and don't forget to stock up on disposable tissues for all those coughs and sneezes!

Make or review your family emergency plan. If an emergency strikes, will your family know what to do? Review your family's emergency plan, or create one for the first time. Update phone numbers, addresses and contact information, and post an Emergency Information Page near the phone.

Recycling Nens

Hundreds of tons of recycling material is collected every day in communities. Unfortunately, a higher percentage of non-recyclable materials are being found in the recycling. That often happens by mistake or due to lack of information. Current recycling markets require clean, quality materials with virtually no contamination. **Some of the most common contaminates that are found in the recycling stream include:**









- Plastic bags, are NOT accepted in single stream recycling. Oftentimes retailers may accept them.
- Pizza boxes, which contain residual grease, cheese or other toppings. Don't include food-soiled items and liquids they can turn an entire load of recycling into trash.
- Bubble wrap and shrink wrap cause damage, down-time and costly repairs to recycling equipment.
- Electrical cords, string/rope material, rubber and plastic hose, clothing. These items are called "tanglers" and can shut down an entire recycling plant!
- Propane tanks, batteries and electronic waste can start fires at the recycling plant.
- Medical equipment and devices of any kind, such as needles, tubing and gloves. They can cause injury to workers.

You can make a difference and ensure recycling is sustainable for generations to come.



Halloween Safety - Trick or Treat

Halloween is not only a busy night for children but for adults as well. There are many precautions that can be taken to have a safe and fun night.

An easy way to deter potential problems is to make sure your house and your property are well lit. Light is one of the biggest deterrents for burglaries. Suspects will most likely choose a dark residence over one that has clear visibility at night.

Extra caution needs to be taken while driving on Halloween not only during the night but during the day as well. Children tend to be pre-occupied with everything going on around them and not paying attention to safely crossing roads with parents or in a crosswalk. If you are the parent of a trick-or-treater, please remind them of road safety and to watch out for cars when crossing the road. Choose paths that are lighted and are familiar to you and your child.

Other things to consider are:

● If you set jack-o'-lanterns on your porch with candles in them, make sure that they are far enough out of the way so that children's costumes will not accidentally be set on fire. Better yet, use battery-operated pumpkin lights.

- Carry your cell phone and a flashlight.
- ♠ Explain to your children that you need to check their candy before the eat any of it.
- ♠ Make sure their costume does not restrict their movement or vision.
- If your child will be carrying a prop such as a pitchfork or sword, make sure the tips are flexible enough to not cause injury if fallen on. Never carry real weapons.
- Tell your children to never go into the home of a stranger or get into their car.
- Make sure you set a time for your children to be home and stress the importance for them to be home at that time.
- Control your pets: don't take a chance that your pet might be frightened and chase or bite a child at your door.




