Village President's Letter

The long Winter has finally passed, and hopefully the Spring rains will soon let up so we can get outside to work in our yards and enjoy time with family and friends. I am pleased to report that despite the challenging weather, great progress was made at the Chapel Hill Golf Course over the past few months. Utility relocations wrapped up and the controlled burn of the old Clubhouse is complete. Demolition crews just finished tearing down the old groundkeepers house that was in disrepair. Demolition debris has been removed from the site and the area has been prepped for seeding. Now that the weather is warming up, I hope you will have a chance to come out and see the improvements while enjoying a round of golf. Summer is also golf cart season in Johnsburg! As warmer weather arrives, make sure you register your golf cart for use on the designated streets throughout the Village. See page 8 for the requirements and ride safe this summer!

Spring started out on a high note for the Village. I am excited to report that Johnsburg has been awarded a Safe Routes to School Grant in the amount of \$195,768 to extend sidewalks along Chapel Hill Road to the bridge. The Illinois Department of Transportation received 168 applications and Johnsburg was one of 28 communities to receive funding for an infrastructure project. I would like to thank Village Administrator Claudett Peters for her efforts in securing the grant and Village Engineer Tim Hartnett for his work on the engineering and design. My sincere thanks also goes out to the parents, teachers, and students who supported our efforts by responding to the surveys and participating in the Walk and Bike to School events held each year in October. The Village of Johnsburg is committed to providing a safe and healthy walking/biking environment for the children in our community.

I am also pleased to report that for the third year in a row, the Village received the **Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting** award from the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) for its comprehensive annual financial report for the fiscal year ended April 30, 2018. This is an amazing honor and I would like to thank **Village Treasurer Kim Giovanni** for her hard work in making this award possible. Much thanks also goes to **Village**

Administrator Claudett Peters, Village Trustee and Finance Chairman Greg Klemstein and the Finance Committee for the work they have done over the past several years to help position the Village to pursue the recognition.



This Spring also marks the beginning of a new four year term on the Village Board for incumbent trustees Tom Curry and Kyle Frost as well as newcomer Beth Foreman. Ms. Foreman is a long time resident of Johnsburg who has been serving on the Village's Planning and Zoning Commission for many years. I look forward to having her on the Village Board as we make great things happen in Johnsburg! I would like to extend a special thanks to retiring Trustee Mary Lou Hutchinson for her 12 years of dedicated service. During her tenure, Trustee Hutchinson served as the Chairman of the Community Affairs, Finance and Ordinance Committees. We truly appreciate her contributions to the Village and wish her well in her future endeavors.

Johnsburg Jewel: Chapel Hill Golf Course



How Important is it to have a Building Permit?

Permits are a form of consumer protection. A contractor who won't pull the required permits might lack appropriate licensing. That's something you should know before a project starts. Permits require an inspector to sign off on work at various stages, depending on the type of project. This provides assurance that framing, plumbing, electrical or other work meets code. Also, a lack of required permits may affect your home's insurance coverage.

Skipping remodeling permits may cost you. If local authorities discover work done without proper authorization, you will be fined. Also, you may end up paying twice for work



because the code enforcement department may require you to remove drywall to inspect work. Other work you already paid for may also have to be redone.

If work is performed without the required permit, you will face fines and still be required to complete the permit process at double the cost. Additionally, work done without a permit will create problems when selling property as proof of inspections is often required. This isn't an area where you want to beg forgiveness rather than ask permission.

Unauthorized work may also be discovered when future buyers hire an inspector, who may seek records related to improvements. The seller may end up paying fines and having problems selling the home.

But how do you know what projects require a permit? The easiest way is to contact the Village Hall at (815) 385-6023 and ask. Generally speaking, any improvement that changes the home's electrical, plumbing or structural systems requires a permit. This means adding on to the home or moving walls inside the existing structure, especially if the walls are load bearing.

All underground work
Pools (above ground and in ground, hot tubs)

Park Vandalism

With the warm weather season upon us, and summer break about to begin, the number of vandalism incidents at Village parks is on the rise. Vandalism is hurtful and costly to a community. Services and improvements are impacted when resources need to be directed at cleaning up vandalism and fixing damaged property. Village parks are equipped with security cameras that monitor facilities 24 hours a day. Vandalism is a crime and the Village will fully prosecute offenders.

Help keep our parks clean and safe for everyone to enjoy. Say NO to vandalism!

Ooluntary Oehicle Sticker Renewal

Although the Village no longer requires the use of vehicle stickers, we do have them available for residents who wish to display one. Stickers are now available and can be purchased at the Village Hall for a cost of \$20. Display of this sticker also enables Village residents to utilize the Riverview Drive Boat Launch.

Use of Non-Highway Vehicles/Golf Carts on Village Roads

Here are a few reminders regarding the use of non-highway vehicles. Golf carts and other qualified non-highway vehicles

Boat Launch Stickers



Boat launch stickers are available at the Village Hall. Anyone wishing to use the Village's boat launch on Riverview Drive is required to purchase a sticker and display it on the vehicle used to launch the boat. The sticker cost for Village residents is \$20 and non-residents may purchase a sticker for \$100.

may be driven on streets within the Village's corporate boundaries with the exception of Johnsburg Road, Ringwood Road and any county roads. Signs have been posted on streets where golf carts are allowed.

In order to drive these vehicles in the Village, you must be 16 years of age, have a valid driver's license and complete the mandatory annual inspection of your vehicle. Please take a couple minutes to verify you are in compliance, this is completed yearly with a December expiration date. The initial cost to register your non-highway vehicle is \$50 and renewals are \$10. This fee includes the cost of a sticker which is required to be displayed. If you have a golf cart or other allowable utility vehicle, or are thinking of purchasing one, please review Chapter 15.15 of the Johnsburg Municipal Code regulating their use. This code can be viewed on the Village's website and at the Village Hall. You may print the non-highway vehicle application from the Village of Johnsburg's website. **Note that the use of four wheelers, motorbikes and other all-terrain vehicles with saddle seats are prohibited on Village streets.**

Spring Brush Pickup

The Johnsburg Public Works Department will be conducting its annual spring brush pickup beginning June 3rd, 2019. All brush must be placed by the road no later than 7:00 a.m. on June 3rd. Crews will make one pass through each subdivision; therefore, any branches that are not placed by the road when they go by will not be picked up at a later time. All branches must be a minimum of six (6) feet in length (longer limbs travel more safely through chipper) and no greater than 6 inches in diameter. They must be placed with their cut ends pointed towards the road in a neat and orderly pile. Please stack brush into multiple manageable piles; avoid making one large pile. Branches that cannot be put through the chipper safely will not be taken. Ev-


ergreen cuttings must be kept separate from other tree branches and will be picked up separately. This service is being provided for larger branches generated from trimming or storm damage and is <u>not intended for disposal of</u> whole trees that have been removed.

2019 Electronic Waste Recycling and Brush Drop Off

These programs will be available now through November on the following Saturdays from 8:00 am to 12:00 noon.

Must live within McHenry Township boundary

- * There will be no recycling in September due to our Touch-A-Truck event *

There will be NO drop off of recycling items during the week. Drop off is located in the township employee parking lot at 3703 N. Richmond Road. Road District employees will be on hand to assist you on the above dates.

The Road District is again partnering with The Environmental Defenders of McHenry County for our recycling program.

Textiles

All textiles (clothes, blankets, towels, etc.) shoes accepted at no charge. Items can be worn out, holes in them, torn but they must be clean.

Lightbulbs

4-foot fluorescent bulbs accepted at a cost of \$.50 each. 8-foot fluorescent bulbs accepted at a cost of \$1.00 each. Compact Fluorescent bulbs (CFLs) accepted at a cost of \$.50 each. All other styles of Fluorescent bulbs accepted at a cost of \$.50 each. Regular light bulbs can be disposed of in your curbside recycling or trash.

Styrofoam

All #6 Styrofoam accepted at no charge.

Commercial and food grade, including colored is all accepted.

Foam must be free of non-Styrofoam debris (tape, glue, etc.). Food stained items are accepted if clean. Wallboard insulation is NOT accepted due to the fireproof ingredients used in the manufacturing process. This item can be thrown away. Foam sheeting is currently NOT being accepted. Bubble wrap and bubble packs are NOT being accepted.

Packing Peanuts

Packing peanuts are accepted if they are in a clean dry box or bag. Packing peanuts are NOT recyclable but they are reusable.

They are collected and then reused.

Batteries

All types of batteries are accepted. Common household batteries, A, C, D, AA, AAA, Lithium, Ni-Cad, Button and NI-MH are accepted at a cost of \$1.00 per pound. Lead batteries (car, motorcycle, sump pump, marine) are accepted for no charge.

VHS Tapes, CD's, DVD's and cassette tapes

These items are all accepted at no charge.

The covers, plastic cases, packaging DO NOT have to be removed.

Election Signs and the Like

The signs and metal are accepted at no charge. Please clean them as best as one can.

Electronics

The following items are accepted at no charge:

Printers, scanners, fax machines, typewriters, stereos and speakers. Vacuum cleaners, floor scrubbers, and rug shampooers. Electric Power Tools, both industrial and hobby Small countertop household appliances (toasters, blenders, coffee makers, etc.). Computers, servers, laptops and related accessories. Electronic games and keyboards. Microwaves, toaster and pizza type ovens. Humidifiers, de-humidifiers, air purifiers. Cell phones, tablets, I-Pods. Hair dryers, razors, electric toothbrushes, and water picks.

The following items are accepted for a fee:

Computer Monitors and Televisions are accepted for a cost of \$1.00 per pound with a cap of \$85 total per item. Cash, check and credit cards are accepted for payment. Small college dorm room refrigerators, and wine coolers are accepted for a fee of \$15.00 per unit.

Paint – latex or oil only (gallon size or smaller containers)

No large kitchen appliances or gasoline powered items accepted.

We will provide one semi-trailer every month. Once the trailer is full, the doors will be closed for that date and recycling will resume the next month.

Brush: Brush, branches and twigs must be no larger than 8 inches in diameter, and 10 feet maximum length. Grass clippings, leaves, rubbish, branches or logs containing dirt or debris will not be accepted. Road District personnel will chip all branches into usable mulch, which will be available to participants at no charge. Any excess mulch will be piled in the Senior/Youth Center parking lot and can be picked up any time the park gates are open.



Fraud Prevention 101

If you believe you have become a victim of fraud, please contact the Johnsburg Police Department at 815.385.6024 (non-emergency) or 9-1-1 for immediate emergency assistance.

Spot imposters. Scammers often pretend to be someone you trust, like a government official, a family member, a charity, or a company you do business with. Don't send money or give out personal information in response to an unexpected request — whether it comes as a text, a phone call, or an email.



Do online searches. Type a company or product name into your favorite search engine with words like "review," "complaint" or "scam." You can even search for phone numbers to see if other people have reported them as scams.

Don't pay upfront for a promise. Someone might ask you to pay in advance for things like debt relief, credit and loan offers, mortgage assistance, or a job. They might even say you've won a prize, but first you have to pay taxes or fees. If you do, they will probably take the money and disappear. Don't fall for it!

Talk to someone. Before you give up your money or personal information, talk to someone you trust. Fraudsters want you to make decisions in a hurry. They might even threaten you. Slow down, check out the story, do an online search or consult with Johnsburg Police Department.
