With the warmer weather approaching here are a few reminders regarding the use of non-highway vehicles. Golf carts and other qualified non-highway vehicles may be driven on streets within the Village's corporate boundaries

with the exception of Johnsburg Road, Ringwood Road and any county roads. Signs have been posted on streets where golf carts are allowed.

n order to drive these vehicles in the Village, you must be 16 years of age, have a valid driver's license and complete the mandatory annual inspection of your vehicle. The initial cost to register your non-highway vehicle is \$50 and renewals are \$10. This fee includes the cost of a sticker which is required to be displayed. If you have a golf cart or other allowable utility vehicle, or are thinking of purchasing one, please review Chapter 15.15 of the Johnsburg Municipal Code regulating their use. This code can be viewed on the Village's website and at the Village Hall. You may print the non-highway vehicle application from the Village of Johnsburg's website. **Note that the use of four wheelers, motorbikes and other all-terrain vehicles with saddle seats are prohibited on Village streets.**

Boat Launch Stickers



Boat launch stickers are available at the Village Hall. Anyone wishing to use the Village's boat launch on Riverview Drive

(Alfred May Park & Boat Launch) is REQUIRED to purchase a sticker and display it on the vehicle used to launch the boat. The sticker cost for Village residents is \$20 and nonresidents may purchase a sticker for \$100. Launching is **NOT RECOMMENDED for boats greater than 24 feet.**

Voluntary Vehicle Sticker Renewal

Although the Village no longer requires the use of vehicle stickers, we do have them available for residents who wish to display one. Stickers are now available and can be purchased at the Village Hall for a cost of \$20. Display of this sticker also enables Village residents to utilize the Riverview Drive Boat Launch.

Stickers will be prorated for the year of 2020, sticker expirations will be December 31, 2020

Launching can be dangerous activity that may present substantial risk. Users assume full responsibility for determining if conditions are safe for launching.

Early Voting

Early voting begins March 2, 2020 for the March 17, 2020 General Primary Election. The ONLY location for early voting will be McHenry Township Offices (3703 N. Richmond Rd. Johnsburg, IL 60051 NOT your designated polling location).

The early voting law, effective in Illinois, allows voters to cast a ballot at an early voting center through Monday, March 16, 2019.

Voting by Mail

Voting by mail is an option for voters to cast their ballot prior to Election Day. Voters can request a vote by mail ballot through the mail or in person. All ballots by mail submitted must be postmarked no later than midnight of election day, for counting no later than during the period for counting provisional ballots, last day of which is the 14th day following election day.

Spring Home Checklist

1. Examine Roof Shingles

Examine roof shingles to see if any were lost or damaged during winter. Shingles that are cracked, buckled or loose or are missing granules need to be replaced. Flashing around plumbing vents, skylights and chimneys need to be checked and repaired.

2. Check for Decayed Wood

Use a screwdriver to probe the wood trim and drywall around windows, doors, railings and decks. Make repairs now before the spring rains do more damage to the exposed wood.

3. Check the Gutters



Check for loose or leaky gutters. Improper drainage can lead to water in the basement or crawl space. Make sure downspouts drain away from the foundation and are clear and free of debris.

4. Inspect Grade and Foundation

Low areas in the yard or next to the foundation should be filled with compacted soil. Spring rains can cause yard flooding, which can lead to foundation

flooding and damage. Also, when water pools in these low areas in summer, it creates a breeding ground for insects.

5. Examine the Chimney

Examine the exterior of the chimney for signs of damage. Have the flue cleaned and inspected by a certified chimney sweep.

6. Inspect Concrete

Inspect concrete slabs for signs of cracks or movement. All exterior slabs except pool decks should drain away from the home's foundation. Fill cracks with a concrete crack filler or silicone caulk. When weather permits, power-wash and then seal the concrete.

7. Check Outside Faucets

Check outside hose faucets for freeze damage. Turn the water on and place your thumb or finger over the opening. If you can stop the flow of water, it is likely the pipe inside the home is damaged and will need to be replaced. While you're at it, check the garden hose for

dry rot.

8. Exterior Home Cleaning

Spring is a good time to give the house a good scrub, washing all the winter away. Grit and grim stuck to the siding can damage paint and masonry over time. Look for signs of peeling or chipping paint. You may need a touch-up or a fresh coat.



9. Service the AC Unit

Have a qualified heating and cooling contractor clean and service the outside unit of the air conditioning system. Clean coils operate more efficiently, and an annual service call will keep the system working at peak performance levels. Change interior filters on a regular basis.

10. Check Power Equipment

Check your gas and battery-powered lawn equipment to make sure it is ready for summer use. Clean equipment and sharp cutting blades will make yardwork easier.

Tohnsburg School District 12 Taxes Abated to Provide Savings to Community

In December 2005, the Johnsburg School District Board of Education accomplished one of its main goals for the year by purchasing 119 acres of land north of the Junior High School and Elementary School campus. This land purchase has provided the District with maximum flexibility to meet any of its future needs. While no building plans are in place at this time, this parcel of land is large enough and adaptable enough that it could be used for any building project that the District may face far into the future.

At the time of purchase, the School Board pledged to use impact fees to abate taxes to fund the purchase of the property. Although the district no longer receives impact fees, the Board has continued, over the many years, with its promise to the community to abate taxes by funding the payment for the property annually with district operating funds. Over the years, by abating these property taxes, Johnsburg School District has saved our community approximately \$4.8 million. At the December 17, 2019 Board of Education meeting, the Board of Education once again approved the abatement of taxes associated with the land purchase for the upcoming year. For the 2019-2020 school year, the District absorbed \$312,300. Johnsburg Schools is proud to say that the final payment for the property is scheduled for December 2020.

Three PACE bus shelters are operational in Johnsburg. One is located at May Avenue and Johnsburg Road; another at the entrance to Rescue Squad Park on Johnsburg Road (coming this Spring) and one on Johnsburg Road by the roundabout.



PACE has been providing bus service in Johnsburg for some time in coordination with the McRide Transportation program; however, pickup locations were not improved with a shelter. The shelters will provide riders protection from the elements while waiting for

buses and increase awareness that bus service is available in the Village. PACE bus route 806 transports riders to many destinations between Fox Lake and Crystal Lake. Spring Brush Pickup

The Johnsburg Public Works Department will be conducting its annual **spring brush pickup beginning June 1, 2020. All brush must be placed by the road no later than 7:00 a.m. on June 1st.** Crews will make one pass through each subdivision; therefore, any branches that are not placed by the road when they go by will not be picked up at a later time. **All branches must be**


a minimum of six (6) feet in length (longer limbs travel more safely through chipper) and no greater than 6 inches in diameter. They must be placed with their cut ends pointed towards the road in a neat and orderly pile. Please stack brush into multiple manageable piles; avoid making one large pile. Branches that cannot be put through the chipper safely will not be taken. Evergreen cuttings must be kept separate from other tree branches and will be picked up separately. This service is being provided for larger branches generated from trimming or storm damage and is **not intended for disposal of whole trees that have been removed.**

Waste Management Lead-Up...

The future of curbside recycling is at risk!

Today, **ONE NON-RECYCLABLE** ITEM CAN SPOIL AN ENTIRE LOAD OF GOOD MATERIALS.

Placing one wrong item in your recycling bin may not seem very important, but it is becoming a global problem that can prevent thousands of tons of recyclables from ever seeing a second life. Help protect the future of recycling by educating yourself about acceptable recyclable materials. Waste Management has created a website to offer tools you can use to make recycling sustainable for future generations. Do your part and follow these simple guidelines.



Open Burning of Landscape Waste

Prohibited At All Times

Burning landscape waste within 100 feet of a habitable structure (residence, school, etc.) and within 50 feet of a non-habitable structure (detached garage, shed, barn, etc.).

Burning of manure, garbage, construction materials, litter, etc. on any property.



Restrictions when Greater Than 100' of a Habitable Structure

Only landscape waste and only on the property where the landscape waste was generated, *during the months of April and May on weekend days (Saturdays & Sundays).* Between dawn and dusk when the winds are less than 10 mph. *Must be supervised by an individual at least 18 years of age and a fire extinguisher, garden hose or water source must be available* at the burning site.

There is no burning on public or private roads, alleys, sidewalks or easements.

Other Residential Exemptions

Recreational fires; not larger than 3'x3'x3', and excludes leaves, grass or shrubbery clippings.

Ceremonial fires (bonfires) larger than 3'x3'x3', and excludes leaves, grass or shrubbery clippings; permit required from McHenry County Department of Health.
