Subject: Snow Removal & Plowing - Don't Bury Critical ComEd Equipment in the Snow


Dear Neighbor:

This seems like an unusually early message to receive in the fall, but ComEd is already planning for the winter months.

You may have ComEd transformers and/or switchgear on your property that may need to be accessed in the winter. Occasionally after a snowstorm, snow removal efforts will result in buried or blocked access to critical ComEd equipment. Occasionally, a snow plow will move snow into our equipment, damaging it and possibly causing a loss in power.

In order to be able to safely access our equipment if necessary, we need to ensure that there is at least ten feet of open space in front of the equipment's cabinet doors. Additionally, we need a foot of clearance on the remaining three sides of the equipment.

To the extent there is ComEd equipment along your plow routes or in parking lots you maintain, please remind your snow removal teams to avoid piling snow around or on ComEd equipment. Doing so can damage our equipment, possibly causing a loss in power or delay in our restoring power due to our inability to gain access. Thank you for reading this message about snow and ComEd equipment.
