## FALL BRUSH PICK UP

## Our regular fall brush pick up will be the week of October 13, 2008

- Crews will <u>only</u> come through subdivisions once
- Brush must be placed curbside by 7:00 a,m. beginning October 13, 2008.
- Evergreen material must be placed separate from deciduous materials.
- All branches are to be faced towards the pavement in neat piles.
- All branches must be a minimum of 4 feet in length and cannot exceed 6 inches in diameter.
- Anything that cannot be put through the chipper safely will not be taken.
- Evergreens will be picked up separately as they cannot be run through the chipper.
- This service is being provided for larger tree and bush branches generated from trimming or storm damage and is not intended to dispose of whole trees that have been removed.

### PUBLIC WORKS DISPLAYS EXTRA EFFORT

Employees of the Public Works Department provided extra assistance recently in response to complications caused by this year's flooding. Residents along River Terrace Avenue found themselves unable to receive garbage pickup due to flood waters requiring a local road closure. The Public Works Department responded by providing special garbage pick for these residents until regular garbage removal services could be resumed. Sandbags and sand were also provided at convenient locations for residents in need. We are quite fortunate to have such dedicated and helpful employees.

## FROM THE VILLAGE PRESIDENT David G. Dominguez



On June 18, 2008, a court hearing was held on motions filed by the Village of Johnsburg in an effort to resolve the litigation related to SSA #23. The Village filed two motions for summary judgment which, if upheld, would have put an end to months of litigation regarding the establishment of the special service area. These were brought after the same court denied the objector's request for a preliminary injunction against the Village. Unfortunately, the Court did not grant the Village's motions to resolve this matter and set the matter for trial on September 30<sup>th</sup>.

SSA #23 was pursued by the Village of Johnsburg last fall in an effort to finance the extension of sewer infrastructure that would bring wastewater treatment services to approximately 670 homes and businesses in the established areas of Johnsburg. These areas have been prone to septic complications due to lot sizes and high ground water, making it difficult for residents to pursue an affordable septic system upgrade for their property. In some cases, the ability to provide for an upgraded system to take the place of a failing septic is an infeasible if not impossible alternative. Annual flooding from storm events has reinforced the need for a centralized wastewater treatment system. A properly operating septic system is unable to perform optimally when impacted by high ground water posing potential health hazards. The McHenry County Department of Health realizes this and supports our efforts (See letter on Pg. 11).

We began planning to bring this much needed service to our residents nearly 15 years ago. Since that time, we have successfully constructed a wastewater treatment plant, central lift station and mains to move wastewater from the older downtown areas of the community to the wastewater treatment plant located on Route 31. Much of the infrastructure constructed to date has been supported by grants that the Village has successfully obtained at both the Federal and State levels.

### SSA #23 CONTINUED:

The Village initiated SSA #23 to fund the extension of the necessary sewer mains through subdivisions which will enable existing residents and business owners to connect to the system. Residents connected to the system would pay for the system with either a one-time payment of \$14,800 or yearly payments of \$1080 per year for 20 years.

The Village pursued this project, understanding that it had a significant environmental and financial benefit to the community. In August, 2007, after passage of the SSA, the Village obtained bids to begin construction of the neighborhood lines which met the cost estimates for the sewer project. Construction was targeted to begin in the late fall of 2007.

The litigation initiated against the Village's use of SSA#23 has effectively delayed construction and prevented the Village from moving forward. Initially, the Village was able to obtain extensions for the bids; however, because of price increases over the past year and the litigation's interference with the Village's ability to accept the favorable bid, contract renewals are no longer available. Re-bidding will take place after a successful court decision is achieved. Unfortunately the total cost impact of the labor and material increases, litigation and lost opportunities of prior low bids will increase the resident's previously projected cost.

The Village will remain committed to provide sewer service at a reasonable price in the changing market. We will continue our efforts in obtaining grants from State and Federal sources, but the financial support from those organizations is limited. As always, the Village is committed to find any and all means to offset the additional cost burden brought on by the litigation.

## Did You Remember To Purchase Your Village Sticker?? Village Vehicle Stickers were due by July 31st!

- Any vehicle housed or registered in the Village for more than thirty days out of the year requires a sticker;
- If you have not purchased your vehicle sticker, please come to the Village Hall between 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. to purchase them;
- The Police Department will issue ordinance violation tickets to any vehicle not complying. Individuals in violation will be fined \$50.00 plus the cost of the sticker.
- Stickers for passenger cars and trucks under 4 tons gross weight are now \$20.00;
- For trucks over 4 tons gross weight, the sticker cost is now **\$50.00**; and
- Motorcycle stickers are now **\$10.00**

### FROM CHIEF KEN RYDBERG: CHILD SAFETY SEAT NEWS

Vehicles manufactured today are safer than they have ever been. With advanced airbags and seatbelts, people have a greater chance of surviving serious motor vehicle crashes, often with minimal injury. However, what is beneficial for adults to be safe in vehicles can often be harmful to children. It is imperative that children be properly restrained in vehicles in order to save their life in the event of a motor vehicle crash. According to Safe Kids USA, "Child safety seats reduce fatal injury in passenger cars by 71 percent for infants less than 1 year old and by 54 percent for toddlers 1 to 4 years of age. For children 4 to 7 years of age, booster seats have shown to reduce injury risk by 59 percent compared to safety belts alone."

The Johnsburg Police Department has a certified child safety seat technician available to ensure that child restraints are properly installed and utilized in your vehicle. This service is free of charge and available to any Johnsburg resident on an appointment basis. Please allow at least 72 hours notice for an appointment. Dear Committee Member,

This is in response to your request for this Department's support of a Waste water conveyance and treatment works project to serve the Village of Johnsburg.

As you are aware there are areas within the Village of Johnsburg where existing site conditions negatively impact the ability of a private sewage disposal system (septic system) to function optimally year round. These areas include properties along the Fox. River and other areas that are subject to seasonal flooding, have excessive surface drainage and/or shallow high groundwater tables. The use of these properties can be severely restricted due to the limitations of a private sewage disposal system to properly operate with the conditions present. When repairs or replacement of the septic system is done on these properties, they typically require detailed site specific design with advanced treatment components to protect groundwater at a cost of tens of thousands of dollars. It should also be noted that it is more cost effective to deal with these problematic areas all at once instead of individually.

There are also properties served by septic systems within the village that due to small lot sizes, water well and/or septic location will face severe restrictions or prohibition, should the owner wish to add bedroom(s), deck, garage, driveway, additions, swimming pool or a shed.

It is in the best interest of the community and that of the property owner to have those properties with the above stated conditions served by a community waste water conveyance and treatment system.
