Did You Remember To Purchase Your Village Sticker?? Any vehicle housed or registered in the Village Veh

Any vehicle housed or registered in the Village for more than thirty days out of the year requires a vehicle sticker. If you have not purchased your vehicle sticker, please come to the Village Hall between 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday to purchase them. The Police Village Vehicle Stickers were Due July 31st!

Department has started issuing ordinance violation tickets to any vehicle not complying. *A violation ticket is now \$100.* Stickers for passenger cars, motorcycles and trucks under 4 tons gross weight purchased after July 31, 2012 are now \$40.00 and for trucks over 4 tons gross weight, the sticker cost is now \$100.00.

** Please Note - there is no senior or disability discount for stickers purchased late after the due date of July 31st.

Sewer Project Update

The Village recently awarded a contract to install gravity sewer along Fairview Avenue from Chapel Hill Road to Church Street. Construction is expected to begin in September and last through November. Fairview Avenue, between Chapel Hill Road and Johnsburg Road, will be closed to thru traffic during parts of the construction and surrounding streets such as Sunnyside Beach, Long, Middle and Stubby will be limited to local traffic only. Thru traffic will be directed to utilize Chapel Hill Road and Johnsburg Road in lieu of Fairview Avenue. Residents residing on Fairview Avenue will still be able to travel to and from their homes and will be notified of construction activities.

This project is possible because of Federal and State funding the Village has received to further our sewer collection system project. The Village would like to thank Senator Pamela Althoff for her efforts in securing the State funds that were just recently released. The Federal funds were secured through the efforts of former Congresswoman Melissa Bean to whom we are also grateful. By installing this infrastructure, we will be that much closer to bringing sewers to more than 400 residents in our community. The Village continues to work to find additional grant opportunities to help offset the cost to bring wastewater treatment to other neighborhoods throughout the Village.

FALL BRUSH PICKUP

The Johnsburg Public Works Department will be conducting its annual fall brush pickup beginning **September 17, 2012.** All brush must be placed by the road no later than 7:00 a.m. on Monday, the 17th of September. Crews will make one pass through each subdivision therefore any branches that are not placed by the road when they go by will not be picked up at a later time. All branches must be a minimum of 4 feet in length and no greater than 6 inches in diameter. They must be placed with their cut ends pointed towards the road in a neat and orderly pile. Branches that cannot be put through the chipper safely will not be taken.

Evergreen cuttings must be kept separate from other tree branches and will be picked up separately. This service is being provided for larger branches generated from trimming or storm damage and is not intended for disposal of whole trees that have been removed.

A Dangerous Immigrant – The Emerald Ash Borer

As U.S. trade with China expanded, the emerald ash borer hitched a ride across the Pacific in wooden packing crates to a new land with few natural predators — our land.



Since they were first detected a decade ago, these half-inch-long, metallic-green insects have been spreading a trail of destruction across

the Midwest. They prey on ash trees, and North America is an all-you-can-eat buffet: At least 7 billion ash trees grow from coast to coast, including millions at risk in populated areas.

The insect damage is difficult to detect in its early stages, but it typically kills within a few years of the initial attack.

Discovered in Kane County Illinois in 2006, the beetles' presence has since been found in Boone, Bureau, Champaign, Cook, DeKalb, DeWitt, DuPage, Effingham, Grundy, Iroquois, Kankakee, Kendall, Lake, LaSalle, Marion, McHenry, McLean, Ogle, Stark, Will and Winnebago counties.

EAB's natural spread is moderate, but its artificial spread can be rapid by people unwittingly transporting this pest through infested firewood and landscape waste. Artificial movement of infested trees has exacerbated the EAB problem in Illinois and North America.

To protect our ash trees, it is our responsibility to minimize the spread of EAB by not transporting firewood outside of its local area. Fireplace owners should buy firewood from a known local source and burn all of it before May 1. Campers should buy firewood at your destination and be sure to burn all wood before leaving the campsite.

Recycling Used Oil What is used oil? Used oil is

any petroleum based or synthetic oil that has been contaminated with dirt, metals, water, or other chemicals such as solvents during use in a process. In addition, used oil must be recycled or burned for energy recovery. Used oils are commonly generated from activities conducted by home-owners (do-it-

yourselfers), farmers, gas stations, oil/lubricating dealers, and various commercial facilities.

Used oil IS NOT a hazardous waste if it is recycled on-site or offsite. However, used oil may be a hazardous waste if it is mixed after the process with hazardous materials such as gasoline or solvents. Therefore, used oil should be separated from other wastes and stored in leak-free containers labeled "Used Oil."

Who can accept used oil? Locally, Quality Tire Service located at 2420 Hiller Ridge in Johnsburg is a green company through the EPA's multiple recycling programs. They are a drop off location for your used oil, oil filters, batteries, and tires.

Johnsburg Police to begin Labor Day crackdown on drunk drivers and seat belt law violators



The Johnsburg Police will be increasing traffic enforcement around the Labor Day weekend, focusing on both drunk and unbuckled drivers. The intensified enforcement effort will focus on late-night hours as statistics show a disproportionate number of traffic deaths occur late at night and involve a drunk driver and/ or unbuckled motorist. The

crackdown is part of the nationwide, Labor Day Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over and Click It or Ticket effort.

Our police officers will join the Illinois State Police and over 200 local police and sheriff's departments in a statewide enforcement effort that begins August 17 and runs through September 3rd. The police department recommends ways to avoid a potential crash or arrest involving drunk driving such as designating a sober driver and not letting friends or family members drive drunk. Other important tips include:

- Plan ahead. Designate a sober driver before going out and give that person your keys;
- If you are drunk, call a taxi or call a sober friend or family member to get you home safely;
- Promptly report drunk drivers you see on the roadways to law enforcement by pulling over and dialing 911;
- Make sure everyone in your vehicle wears their seat belt. It is your best defense against a drunk driver.

The law enforcement crackdown is funded by federal traffic safety funds through IDOT's Division of Traffic Safety. The crackdown runs concurrent with a media campaign that reminds motorists, "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over" and "Click It or Ticket."
