#### **Breaking News:**

As we begin a new fiscal year, many exciting things are occurring. Your village officials have been working closely with Metra to secure passenger rail service to the village through the development of a new train station and rail yard. The proposed site is located on farmland, west of the railroad tracks, north of McCullom Lake Road. Although this improvement will not be constructed for some time, it will provide a much needed transportation alternative to our area and help improve traffic congestion both locally and regionally. We will continue to provide you more information as the project moves forward.

Walmart Super Center is coming to Johnsburg with construction planned to begin in the near future. The center will be located on the west side of Route 31, across from the J.C. Penney and The Shops at Fox River. We are excited about the shopping opportunities these quality developments have and will bring to our community.

Lastly, I would like to close by saying a few words about the Village Board's recent decision to appeal SSA #23. The board is concerned with the impact of the court's ruling on the future use of SSAs to guarantee funding for improvements to our community. We feel that clarification is needed regarding the court's ruling and therefore chose to appeal to the Appellate Court to review the matter. This decision in no way negates the board's commitment NOT to proceed with the sewer project as it was initially proposed "due to dramatic changes in the economy and concern for our resident's financial viability", as stated in the February 6th press release. **Our efforts are intently focused on finding alternative solutions to provide an affordable wastewater collection system to our residents in need.** Regardless of the Appellate Court's ruling, we will not proceed with the sewer project as financially designed until other sources of funding are obtained that make it affordable, as previously promised. In the months ahead I will keep you informed of the Village's progress.

#### Sunnyside Tavern

Part of this plan includes the possibility of the Village obtaining right of way so that we may improve and maintain this section of Church Street in the future.

For now, I'd like to extend a sincere thanks to Gary and Cheryl Rabine for their generous contribution to our community. They truly represent how neighbors are helping neighbors in Johnsburg.

#### FROM CHIEF KEN RYDBERG: CHILD SAFETY SEAT NEWS

Vehicles manufactured today are safer than they have ever been. With advanced air bags and seat belts, people have a greater chance of surviving serious motor vehicle crashes, often with minimal injury. However, what is beneficial for adults to be safe in vehicles can often be harmful to children. It is imperative that children be properly restrained in vehicles in order to save their life in the event of a motor vehicle crash. According to Safe Kids USA, "Child safety seats reduce fatal injury in passenger cars by 71 percent for infants less than 1 year old and by 54 percent for toddlers 1 to 4 years of age. For children 4 to 7 years of age, booster seats have shown to reduce injury risk by 59 percent compared to safety belts alone."

The Johnsburg Police Department has a certified child safety seat technician available to ensure that child restraints are properly installed and utilized in your vehicle. This service is free of charge and available to any Johnsburg resident on an appointment basis. Please allow at least 72 hours notice for an appointment. #### PROPERTY MAINTENANCE

The Village's Building Department has experienced numerous property maintenance complaints since the snow has melted and will be strictly enforcing the nuisance ordinances of the Village. Accumulation of junk and debris is the biggest complaint we receive at this time of the year, followed closely by inoperable vehicles being stored on residential properties. Accumulation of junk and debris can be anything from having appliances or furniture in the yard to accumulation of garbage, car parts, old sinks and toilets, etc on your property in the public's plain view.

#### We appreciate everyone's help in keeping Johnsburg the beautiful community it is today.

Village ordinance states that all inoperable vehicles must be stored out of public's plain view. Any vehicle being kept in a residential area must be road ready and have current state registration and village vehicle stickers. We also receive complaints regarding long grass and weeds, mostly on vacant lots but occasionally on residential yards. Any grass or weeds allowed to grow in excess of eight (8) inches is in violation of Village Ordinance. We will be canvassing neighborhoods throughout the Village and will be sending out notices to the property owners giving them a certain time frame to have the junk and debris cleaned up, the inoperable vehicle removed or the long grass and weeds cut down. Once the time period has expired, daily citations or notices to appear in court will be issued. We appreciate everyone's help in keeping Johnsburg the beautiful community it is today.

### DISTRICT 12 REGISTRATION

Johnsburg Schools continue to look at ways to reduce expenditures, more effectively utilize technology, and help the environment. As a result and for the convenience of our families, the Johnsburg School District's registration process for the 2009-10 School year will be done online. By using an online registration process, we will be able to significantly reduce paper usage, utilize our current technological resources and shrink our mailing costs, which can be up to \$3.00 per student.

The Johnsburg School District's registration process for the 2009-10 School year will be done online.

As most people know, registration is the process in which you indicate to us that your child will be enrolled in Johnsburg Schools for the upcoming school year. During the new online process, parents will be able to update any demographic changes, - address, phone, emergency contact info, health concerns, etc. As an added convenience, the new process will allow you to conveniently pay the registration fees online with a credit/debit card. If you choose, you will still have the option to pay your registration fees by check which can be mailed or dropped off to the Administration Office.

The registration process can be done from any home computer, work computer, library computer etc. All that is needed is a computer with an internet connection and Adobe Acrobat Reader. Once the registration process begins, parents simply need to visit the district website and follow the links. It is as easy as that. Step by step directions will be provided on the website to help parents navigate through the registration procedure. The online registration process will begin June 23rd and run until July 17th.

Please call the district office if you have any questions or issues regarding registration. In addition, parents may come into the Johnsburg Administration Office to use the school computers and have assistance in completing any information. We are confident that this will be a convenient and relatively simple process.

# 2009-2010 VEHICLE STICKERS

Vehicle Stickers are now on sale at the Johnsburg Village Hall. Applications were mailed the first week of June and **stickers must be purchased no later than close of business on July 31st to avoid paying a penalty.** If the pre-printed information on the cards sent to you is incorrect, please correct the information and either bring the forms into the Village Hall or mail the entire postcard with a check made payable to the Village of Johnsburg. If you did not receive your applications or need additional ones, please contact the Village Hall at 815-385-6023. Failure

to receive an application in the mail does not absolve you from having to purchase a sticker. Any vehicle housed or registered in the Village for more than 30 days out of the year must have a sticker displayed. Vehicles that have temporary license plates also must have a sticker as well as company vehicles being kept in the Village if they do not have a sticker from the town they are registered in. Below are the cost of stickers if purchased by July 31st:

Passenger cars and trucks up to 4 tons gross weight owned by person under 64\$10.00Passenger cars and trucks up to 4 tons gross weight owned by person 64 and over\*\$ 5.00Passenger cars and trucks with permanent Disability license plates or placards\*\$ 5.00Motorcycles or Motorbikes\$ 5.00Trucks over 4 tons gross weight\$ 25.00



\* Licenses purchased by persons aged 64 and over and licenses purchased for vehicles with permanent Disability license plates or placards shall be limited to tow (2) reduced fee licenses per household.
