## FROM THE PRESIDENT A YEAR IN REVIEW

ach year at this time I take a moment to reflect back and write about some of the more significant changes and accomplishments of the previous year. In 2012 we saw the following:

- Police Officer Michael Vollmer was promoted to the position of Sergeant and Vincenza LaMontagna and Kevin Del Re were hired to fill two vacant police officer positions. The Village also hired its first part-time Community Service Officer - Randy Schmitt.
- The Administration Department welcomed Marikay Gebis to replace Ellen Bathje who retired from her position in the spring. With dedicated, hardworking employees and improved operational efficiencies, the Village continues to operate with 20% less personnel than it did in 2007 while still insuring that the community's needs are met.
- The Village Board, with input from its strategic planning partners consisting of residents, business owners, and representatives of area governmental entities and other organizations developed a vision statement for the Village.
- The Village participated in the 2nd Annual State of the Village dinner presentation hosted by the Johnsburg Area Business Association.
- Residents voted NO to a referendum question regarding electric aggregation as an opt-out energy supply alternative for households and small businesses.
- The Village Board unanimously approved the FY 2013 budget. This consensus was developed using the same conservative spending policies implemented over the past several years. Proactive reductions and the implementation of a Comprehensive Capital Improvement, Maintenance and Replacement Plan have positively positioned the Village to address both operational and capital demands, now and into the future.

Thank you to Johnsburg State Bank for their generous donation towards postage for the Voice of Johnsburg.

- The Village acquired a key parcel of land located at the southwest corner of St. Johns Avenue and Church Street. The acquisition was pursued to accommodate future realignment and improvements to Church Street. The Village can now seek grants for the improvements.
- The Village also received a donation of approximately 18 acres of land from Ms. Dorothy Hughes located at the southwest corner of Riverside Drive and Chapel Hill Road. The property is an important component to our storm water drainage system. We are truly grateful to Ms. Hughes for her generous contribution to the Village.
- Efforts continued by the Economic Development Committee regarding the development of a Downtown/Town center vision. The Village also moved forward with a sewer extension project along Fairview Avenue from Chapel Hill Road to Church Street. This project, which was 100% funded through federal and state grants, will enable the Village to eventually serve more than 400 households and businesses. I thank Senator Pamela Althoff and former Congresswoman Melissa Bean for their efforts in securing the funding for this project.
- Litigation concluded in a suit brought against the Village regarding the ownership of Maple Avenue with the judge finding in favor of the Village. The judge's finding preserves the Village's ownership of Maple Avenue, a public right of way. Litigation also concluded in a development related matter which the Village pursued to enforce obligations under an annexation agreement. The judge found in favor of the Village and directed the developer to fulfill its obligation under the annexation agreement.
- Cameras were installed in Sunnyside Park to improve security and address vandalism concerns. The Village approved the construction of dugouts at Hiller Park. Construction began on the dugouts in the fall and will be completed early in the spring benefitting the 2013 season. The Village also approved control system improvements (SCADA) for the wastewater treatment system. The improvements will enable public works personnel to monitor and manage sewer infrastructure remotely to help insure proper functioning of the system.
- The Village entered into a contract with Fox Bluff Corporation to audit its telecommunication and energy system costs. The audit resulted in a change to the Village's electric supplier which will provide a savings of approximately 30% annually.
- Beginning with the fall 2012 edition, residents and business owners once again started receiving their newsletter through the mail. This was done in response to requests by many residents who wished to receive a hard copy of the newsletter rather than receive it electronically. The Village entered into a contract with DP Design to handle all the marketing and development details. The cost is covered through the sale of advertisements to area businesses. We thank our area businesses for their support and the State Bank Group who provided the funding to cover the cost of postage for the first year.

• The Johnsburg Police Department once again hosted the Chief's Challenge 5K Run Walk and Cop on Top fundraisers. Proceeds from these events went to the Illinois Special Olympics. Family, friends and neighbors came together in October to enjoy the annual Celebration in the Park event coordinated by the Community Affairs Committee who also hosted a Meet and Greet Santa event in December, both of which were very successful.

Looking back, 2012 was a busy year. By working together we accomplished a great deal. As I have often said, the generosity and dedication of our residents, businesses and civic organizations is second to none. We truly are a "Hometown with Spirit". I wish all of you and your families a healthy and successful 2013.



# Community Sailing @ Pistakee A new twist on an old tradition

ow would you like to get out and learn how to sail this summer? Thanks to a hard working group of volunteers that are revamping the Pistakee Yacht Club Sailing School, you can.

Sailing has been a part of our community since the late 1800's but has often been perceived as a costly and elite sport, it's not. Currently registered as Pistakee Yacht Club Sailing School, the group has decided to change its name to Community Sailing @ Pistakee (CS@P) in an effort to break down perceived barriers and encourage participation throughout the community.

Summer classes will begin in June and

wrap up in August. The Intro "Kindersail" class will be held on Saturday mornings and will provide 4-7 year olds a taste of the sport along with their parents. Morning Intro and Afternoon Intermediate to Advanced Level courses will be offered to children 8-12 year olds. Full day, weeklong options will alternate every other week between Intro and Performance level classes for 12-18 year old participants, and two - 4 week sessions for Adults and parent/child classes are scheduled for Wednesday evenings from 5:30-8:00 p.m. Costs are less than \$15 per hour of instruction and all of the instructors are trained and certified by US Sailing - the governing body of the sport.

Long term goals of the CS@P initiative include providing a platform for High School Students to create teams that will compete in the spring and fall with more than 50 schools that are already active in Illinois, Wisconsin, Minnesota, and Michigan. They also look forward to collaborating with teachers and schools that want to teach Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) programs through sailing a curriculum that is already being used around the country.



Lessons are less than \$15 per hour of instruction and all of the instructors are trained and certified by US Sailing - the governing body of the sport.

The Committee, consisting of long-time residents Tom Kartheiser, Kathleen Winkiel, Jim Huemann and Sally Lucke-Elkes, have committed to purchase a fleet of new boats and has hired a national level program director to lead the restructuring, hiring and training of staff in 2013. Through the "Sail into the Future" Capital Campaign they have already raised enough to develop a new website and purchase two new boats. The campaign goal is to raise \$100,000 over the next two years. Once the campaign has run its course the expectation is that the school will be large enough to support its continued operations through class registrations.

## **Johnsburg Road Roadway Construction for 2013**

he McHenry County Division of Transportation is working to begin construction on Johnsburg Road this year. The project limits are from Illinois Route 31 east to St. Johns Avenue/Chapel Hill Road. As most of the project is ready for construction, McHenry County is proceeding by splitting the project into two construction contracts to take advantage of this year to construct a majority of the project.

This first contract (Contract 1), which is out for contractors to bid on now, will be from Illinois Route 31 east to a point approximately 500 feet west of the St. Johns Avenue/ Chapel Hill Road intersection. Contract 1 will include building two-way continuous left turn

lane along Johnsburg Road, new traffic signals at the Riverside Drive and Spring Grove Road intersections, and lowering the hills west of Riverside Drive to improve driver visibility. To construct Contract 1, a partial detour along the project is necessary. The partial detour will allow traffic to travel westbound only from Cherokee Drive east to the St. Johns Avenue/Chapel Hill Road intersection. Access to all driveways and streets will remain open during construction.

Construction on Contract 1 is planned to begin this spring likely in April/May. More information will be made available as the start of construction nears. In

addition, a Construction Informational Meeting will be scheduled later this spring open to the public. At this meeting, County staff will be available to discuss the construction schedule, the partial detour, and information on who to contact during construction.

It is anticipated that Contract 2 of the project will begin in the fall of 2013 or spring of 2014 depending on project readiness. Contract 2 primarily consists of the construction

of a modern roundabout at the St. Johns Avenue/Chapel Hill Road intersection. Also during Contract 2, street enhancements will be completed. From Spring Grove Road east to St. Johns Avenue/Chapel Hill Road, the sidewalk on both sides of Johnsburg Road will be finished along with other public amenities such as decorative roadway lighting, park benches and trash receptacles.

The project is funded by primarily by federal grants to alleviate roadway congestion, improve safety and provide street enhancements (sidewalks, lighting, etc.) with additional funding from McHenry County and the Village of Johnsburg.

## **LOCAL BUSINESS REGISTRATIONS**

n accordance with Chapter 7.01-B of the Johnsburg Municipal Code, all businesses are required to register with the Village no later than April 30th of each year. This includes home based businesses as well. Registration questionnaires are available through the Village Hall. The annual registration fee of \$25.00 is waived if the registration questionnaire is completed and returned to the Village by April 30th.

If you've registered your business in previous years, you will receive a prefilled registration form which simply needs to be updated and returned to the Village. If you are a new business or have not registered in the past, you can either print the registration form from our website at johnsburg.org (Click on Resident Handbook then Forms) or stop by the

# **Household Tips**

## **Spring Preparation Tips**

Spring arrives as a welcome break from the winter doldrums. Start addressing things inside and then move outside as the weather warms up.

### **INSIDE:**

Set your timers and clocks ahead one hour. Check for daylight saving time and remember to adjust any timers on household gadgets, indoor and outdoor lights, and those regulating the thermostats on your heating system.

Start kitchen herbs inside and transplant later in May. Basil, chives, dill, parsley, and fennel can be started from seeds. Oregano, rosemary, sage, savory, and tarragon do better if you start them from small plants or cuttings.

Change the batteries in your smoke detectors. In addition to testing batteries regularly, you should change these twice a year without fail.

Wash your windows. Clean the residue left behind by winter storms by tackling the job while the weather is still cool to prevent streaking. Start indoors before installing your screens, then finish the job outside on a dry day.

#### **OUTSIDE:**

Clean the deck to remove grime, pollen, fungus, and mildew. Scrub the surface with a deck cleanser or this homemade cleaning formula: Add one cup of powdered laundry detergent to a gallon of hot water, and add 1/2 cup of chlorine bleach to kill moss or mildew.

Check shrubs and trees for winter damage and prune accordingly. Remove deadwood or broken branches. Replant any shrubs that have heaved out of the soil during a freeze-thaw cycle, before the roots dry out.

Bring your garden hose out of storage. Check for cracks and leaks and examine the rubber or plastic washers at the connectors as well.

# **School Board Abates Taxes on District-Owned Land**

In December 2005, the Johnsburg School Board accomplished one of its main goals for the year by purchasing 119 acres of land north of the Junior High School. This land purchase has provided the District with maximum flexibility to meet any of its future needs. While no building plans are in place at this time, this parcel of land is large enough and adaptable enough that it could be used for any building project that the District may face in the foreseeable future. Johnsburg School District 12 continues to work with the Village of Johnsburg and the Village of Ringwood regarding potential growth.

At the December 11, 2012 Board of Education meeting, the Board continued to meet their pledge of abating those taxes associated with the land purchase for the upcoming year. This means that the cost of the land will continue to be paid for by the new growth occurring in the District. By continuing to abate these taxes, the Board of Education will shift the financial burden for the cost of this land on the new growth we are seeing.

# Pre-Kindergarten Registration and Screening

Johnsburg School District 12 will hold registration for children three, four and five years of age who have not yet entered kindergarten. Registration will take place on March 12th from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. and from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.; and on March 13th from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. at Ringwood School Primary Center. Registration is required for all preschool children ages three through five, even if the child has registered and been screened in previous years. 
