Fiscal Year 2012 Budget Approved

he Finance Committee and the Village Board have completed the Annual Budget Review which included the implementation of a new Capital Fund. Department heads along with the Village Engineer and the Public Works Committee identified capital needs and the associated ongoing and future costs for maintenance, replacement and improvements related to vehicles, equipment, facilities and infrastructure. Now more than ever, it is crucial that the Village plan for these short-term and long-term budget impacts to insure that funds will be available when needed. At the April 26, 2011 Board meeting, the Village Board approved the FY2012 Budget which includes the Capital Fund proposed by Village Staff and the Finance Committee. As was the case last year, the local share of the State Income Tax continues to be threatened. The amount of Income Tax collected per capita is projected to go down from \$77 to \$73 this fiscal year. That coupled with the decrease in total population resulting from the 2010 Census has decreased Village revenues by more than \$67,000. The State now lags three months behind on its distribution to local municipalities and is still intending to further reduce the Village's share of State Income Tax by 30%, which will result in an additional decrease in revenues to the Village of \$146,000. Although the State has increased Income Tax withholdings from 3% to 5%, the amount of State Income Tax collected and distributed locally has decreased from 10% to 6%. We urge you to contact your State Senator and Representative to ask that they do not support additional decreases in the local share of State Income Tax.

One of the key strategies put forth by the Finance Committee last year was the need to "Sure up and maintain the long-term financial stability of the Village." Long-range revenue projections continue to reveal long-term budgetary shortfalls. Short-term adjustments allow for a temporary balancing of the budget, but do not support the fiscal framework necessary to attain the Village's strategic priorities. The Village continues to look for ways to cut costs and improve efficiencies in its operations and the implementation of the new Capital Fund is a positive step towards insuring our long-term financial security.

2011-2012 VEHICLE STICKERS

Vehicle Stickers will be going on sale at the Johnsburg Village Hall beginning June 1st. Applications will be mailed during the first week of June and stickers must be purchased no later than close of business on July 29th to avoid paying a penalty. The Village Hall is not open on Saturdays or Sundays, therefore, vehicle stickers must be purchased by July 29th. If the pre-printed information on the card(s) sent to you is incorrect, please correct the information and either bring the forms into the Village Hall or mail the postcard(s) with a check made payable to the Village of Johnsburg. If you did not receive your application(s) or need additional ones, please contact the Village Hall at 815-385-6023. Failure to receive an application in the mail does not absolve you from having to purchase a sticker. Any vehicle housed or registered in the Village for more than 30 days of the year must have a sticker displayed. Vehicles that have temporary license plates also must have a sticker as do company vehicles being kept in the Village that do not have a sticker from the town in which they are registered. Below is the cost of stickers if purchased by July 29th:

Passenger cars and trucks up to 4 tons gross weight owned by person under 64 \$10.00

Passenger cars and trucks up to 4 tons gross weight owned by person 64 and over* \$ 5.00

Passenger cars and trucks with permanent Disability license plates or placards* \$ 5.00

Motorcycles or Motorbikes \$ 5.00

Trucks over 4 tons gross weight \$25.00

*Stickers purchased by persons aged 64 and over and stickers purchased for vehicles with permanent Disability license plates or placards shall be limited to two (2) reduced fee licenses per household.

Memorial Day 2011

his year's Memorial Day event will have a special meaning to us all. This past year, Johnsburg has mourned the loss of two of its World War II veterans who were very active in the community for several decades. Johnsburg VFW Post Commander Dennis Hall has announced that the river wreath laying ceremony will be dedicated in honor of the memory and patriotism of Robert Kastner, Sr., US Navy. The culminating ceremonies at the Johnsburg Community Club will be dedicated in honor of Silver Star recipient, Elmer (Si) Meyers, US Army. As in the past, we honor all those who have served or have been lost in combat during sea battles at our riverside ceremonies along the Fox River. We also honor those who have served or have been lost in land battles at the Armed Services Memorial, where many families have placed engraved commemorative bricks in support of the Johnsburg Community Club Honors program. You can obtain more information about the Honors program by visiting the Johnsburg Community Club website at www. johnsburgcommunityclub.com.

The Fox River will be closed to boat traffic under the Chapel Hill Bridge during the ceremonies from 9:00 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. Participants in the ceremony will be staged on the 7-Days Market property who is hosting the event. Aircraft will again fly over in honor of aircrews lost in combat. The starting ceremonies can be viewed best from the Chapel Hill Bridge or by boats moored on the west side of the river. The parade will begin immediately after the ceremony, beginning at Fairview Avenue, continuing along Chapel Hill Road, St. Johns Avenue and then proceeding along Church Street to the Johnsburg Community Club. Those wishing to participate in the parade must register in advance. You can registration online at www.johnsburgVFW.org. Simply type in the information requested on the Parade Entry Form and Click "REGISTER" to send.

Patriotic music by the Johnsburg HS Band and Choir will be an important part of the morning's events as will be the playing of bagpipes and other special musical talents that will capture your patriotic pride. After the concluding ceremony at the Community Club, the Johnsburg Community Men's Club and Johnsburg Lions will prepare and pass out

Village Notes

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE

The Village's Building Department has experienced numerous property maintenance complaints and will be strictly enforcing the nuisance ordinances of the Village. Accumulation of junk and debris is the biggest complaint received at this time of the year. We also receive complaints regarding inoperable vehicles being stored on residential properties and refuse containers being stored in the public's plain view or left at the road after garbage and recycling pickup.

It is in violation of Village ordinance to permit the accumulation of junk and debris on property. Junk and debris includes anything from appliances or furniture to garbage, car parts, old sinks and toilets. *Village ordinance states that all inoperable vehicles must also be stored out of the public's plain view.* Any vehicle being kept in a residential area must be road ready and have current state registration and Village vehicle stickers.

Refuse containers must be stored out of the public's plain view. They may not be placed by the road more than 24 hours prior to garbage and recycling pickup and must be removed from the road no more than 24 hours after the pickup.

The Village also receives complaints regarding long grass and weeds. Grass or weeds allowed to grow in excess of eight (8) inches is in violation of Village Ordinance.

We will be canvassing neighborhoods throughout the Village and sending out notices to property owners in violation providing them a time frame to have junk and debris cleaned up, inoperable vehicle removed, refuse containers properly stored, or long grass and weeds cut down. If the violation is not addressed in a timely manner daily citations and notices to appear at an Administrative Adjudication Hearing may be issued. We appreciate everyone's help in keeping Johnsburg the beautiful community it is today.

Community Affairs Committee

At the Village Board meeting on April 12th, Village Engineer Tim Hartnett reviewed the status of improvements to Johnsburg Rescue Squad Memorial Park (located next to the Johnsburg Community Club property and Tigers Field). Last year the Johnsburg Rescue Squad Retired generously pledged \$150,000 towards improvements to the Park. Clearing of non-ornamental trees and some grading of the land took place before winter and work will continue this spring with the filling and grading of a small parking area on the south end of the property. Some additional grading will take place over the remainder of the park, a detention area will be constructed, and the park will be seeded for grass. The design for this park includes a parking area and small gazebo at the south end of the property accessed from Johnsburg Road. A walking path will be constructed around the Park tying the gazebo to the existing Pavilion. Renderings of the planned improvements are available to view at the Village Hall.

As a reminder, the pavilion at Johnsburg Rescue Squad Memorial Park is available for special events. The pavilion hosted its first wedding ceremonies last year! Contact the Village Hall at 815-385-6023 for more information on reserving the pavilion.

Lastly, acting on feedback received at the Village's recent Strategic Planning meeting in January, an inventory of current park facilities and a plan regarding future field needs is underway to accommodate increased activities and enrollment in local sports organizations. Village Engineer Tim Hartnett has taken the input received from local sports leagues and is mapping them against available parks resources. Additionally, the Committee is seeking to include available fields from other local government entities, schools, and civic organizations in our planning process. We hope to maximize opportunities for all participants in these leagues by making full use of all the fields in our region.

By updating our Parks Plan, the Village can act on specific improvements that over time will meet the long-term needs of our community. Due to the current economic conditions, improvements may take time to implement however the updated Parks Plan will provide a structured path for park facilities that everyone will enjoy. Leaders from the various sports organizations in town have been engaged in the planning process and resident input will also be solicited. For more information, please contact the Village Hall.

SPRING BRUSH PICKUP

The Johnsburg Public Works Department will be conducting its annual spring brush pickup beginning June 6, 2011. **All brush must be placed by the road no later than 7:00 a.m. on June 6th.** Crews will make one pass through each subdivision therefore any branches that are not placed by the road when they go by will not be picked up at a later time. All branches must be a minimum of 4 feet in length and no greater than 6 inches in diameter. They must be placed with their cut ends pointed towards the road in a neat and orderly pile. Branches that cannot be put through the chipper safely will not be taken. Evergreen cuttings must be kept separate from other tree branches and will be picked up separately. This service is being provided for larger branches generated from trimming or storm damage and is not intended for disposal of whole trees that have been removed.

SOMETHING FROM THE ARCHIVES

hen we started this segment of the newsletter, I was asked "What is the oldest building in Johnsburg?" In the February 2010 edition of the Voice of Johnsburg, I reported that the oldest building is located on the northwest corner of Johnsburg Road and St Johns Avenue and was built in 1857. It currently is the home of Keystone Mortgage. As I previously reported, it was probably built by John Frett and later became John Carl Debrecht's general store. I recently came across a letter that I received in 1991 from one of John Carl Debrecht's sons, Eugene. In reading the letter I discovered that John Carl was born in St. Louis, Missouri. He married Theresa Schramm and had four children - Edwin, Emil, Alfred and Stella. John Carl and Theresa ran a general store and post office in Flint Hill, Missouri until Theresa's death. At that time, the teacher in Flint Hill was Margaretta (Margaret) Henrietta Schoemacher, who was born in Johnsburg. When Margaret was informed by her doctors that she could not have children, she decided to marry a man who did. According to church records, John Carl and Margaret were married in Johnsburg on October 20, 1905. Proving the doctors wrong, they promptly had five children of their own - Eulalie, Antoinette, Leander, Eugene and Angieve.

Margaret's father, Johann Schoemacher, was a tailor that came from Prussia, Germany in 1862. In German a tailor is called a Schneider and Margaret is abbreviated as Krit, so she was known as Schneiders Krit. When the demand for tailor made clothes gave way to store bought, her father started farming on Ringwood Road. John Carl DeBrecht purchased the building at the corner of St. Johns Avenue and Johnsburg Road on April 10, 1905 from John P. Lay. John Carl and his wife opened up a general store and prospered while in Johnsburg. In time, Margaret became restless and filled her time designing a new home to accommodate their growing family. At the time it was built, the house was considered to be a "modern marvel", having a full basement with a well and pump to supply water throughout the house and a separate well to supply soft rain water for laundry. The second floor contained four bedrooms, a full bath and a laundry chute to carry soiled clothes down to the basement. One of the many advanced features was central heating provided by a furnace in the basement that supplied hot water to radiators throughout the house. The home she designed still stands today- it is the large white home right behind the Keystone Mortgage building on St. Johns Avenue.
