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### **PROPERTY MAINTENANCE**


The Village's Building Department has experienced numerous property maintenance complaints and will be strictly enforcing the nuisance ordinances of the Village. Accumulation of junk and debris is the biggest complaint received at this time of the year. We also receive complaints regarding inoperable vehicles being stored on residential properties and refuse containers being stored in the public's plain view or left at the road after garbage and recycling pickup.

It is in violation of Village ordinance to permit the accumulation of junk and debris on property. Junk and debris includes anything from appliances or furniture to garbage, car parts, old sinks and toilets. Village ordinance states that all inoperable vehicles must also be stored out of the public's plain view. Any vehicle being kept in a residential area must be road ready and have current state registration and Village vehicle stickers.

The Village receives many complaints about the storage of refuse and recycling containers. Refuse and recycling containers may not be placed by the road more than 24 hours prior to garbage and recycling pickup and must be removed from the road no more than 24 hours after the pickup. Between pickup days, refuse and recycling containers cannot be stored in front of residential or commercial properties. All containers must be properly screened from the public's view.

The Village also receives complaints regarding long grass and weeds. Grass or weeds allowed to grow in excess of eight (8) inches is in violation of Village Ordinance.

Village personnel will be actively enforcing these ordinances. If a violation is identified, citations and notices to appear at an Administrative Adjudication Hearing will be issued. *We appreciate everyone's help in keeping Johnsburg the beautiful community it is today.*

### **ANIMAL CONTROL**

Chapter 14 of the Johnsburg Municipal Code prohibits any dog, cat or other domestic animal from "running at large". The Village has received many complaints regarding unrestrained dogs traveling into the roadway oftentimes threatening pedestrians and bicyclists. Domestic animals must be restrained on their owner's property. If they are found to be running at large, they will be apprehended and citations will be issued in accordance with the Village's Ordinances.

### **SOLICITORS**

Chapter 10 of the Johnsburg Municipal Code requires persons engaging in peddling or commercial soliciting to obtain a Certificate of Registration from the Village. Solicitors are required to carry a copy of the Certification with them when conducting solicitations throughout the Village. Should you be approached by a solicitor at your home, ask them to produce their Certification to insure that they have registered with the Village. If you have questions or concerns regarding solicitation activities taking place in your neighborhood, contact the Johnsburg Police Department at 815-385-6024.

### **SPRING BRUSH PICKUP**

The Johnsburg Public Works Department will be conducting its annual spring brush pickup beginning June 3, 2013. All brush must be placed by the road no later than 7:00 a.m. on June 3rd. Crews will make one pass through each subdivision. Any branches that are not by the road when they go by will not be picked up at a later time. All branches must be a minimum of 4 feet in length and no greater than 6 inches in diameter. They must be placed with their cut ends pointed towards the road in a neat and orderly pile. Branches that cannot be put through the chipper safely will not be taken. Evergreen cuttings must be kept separate from other tree branches and will be picked up separately. This service is being provided for larger branches generated from trimming or storm damage and is not intended for disposal of whole trees that have been removed.

Additionally, Waste Management is now picking up yard waste. The above referenced stickers can be used on a 35 gallon can or bag of yard waste as well, or residents can enroll in a yard waste subscription program by contacting Waste Management directly at 800-796-9696.



### Area News 2013-2014 VEHICLE STICKERS



Vehicle Stickers will be going on sale at the Johnsburg Village Hall beginning June 1st. Please make sure to purchase your vehicle sticker by July 31st to avoid paying additional costs. Additionally, note that the cost of a citation for failure to purchase and display a vehicle sticker is \$100.00.

Applications will be mailed during the first week of June and stickers must be purchased no later than the close of business on July 31st to avoid paying a penalty. Watch for the salmon colored applications in the mail. If the preprinted information on the card(s) sent to you is incorrect, please correct the information and either bring the forms into the Village Hall or mail the postcard(s) with a check made payable to the Village of Johnsburg. If you did not receive your application(s) or need additional ones, please contact the Village Hall at 815-385-6023. Failure to receive an application in the mail does not absolve you from having to purchase a sticker. Any vehicle housed or registered in the Village for more than 30 days of the year must have a sticker displayed. This regulation also applies to seasonal or weekend residents. Vehicles that have temporary license plates also must have a sticker as do company vehicles being kept in the Village that do not have a sticker from the town in which they are registered. Below is the cost of stickers:

\*Stickers purchased by persons aged 64 and over and stickers purchased for vehicles with permanent disability license plates or placards shall be limited to two (2) reduced fee licenses per household. This reduced fee does not apply to stickers purchased after July 31st.

### JOHNSBURG ROAD IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Construction will begin shortly on the first phase of the Johnsburg Road Improvement Project which consists of the area between Route 31 to approximately 500 feet west of the St. Johns Avenue/ Chapel Hill Road intersection. During the construction, traffic along Johnsburg Road between Chapel Hill Road and Route 31 will be limited to west bound only. **Keep abreast of the construction's impacts by visiting the project's website at johnsburgroad.com.** There you can also sign up to receive email alerts and updates related to the project.

### VILLAGE 2013 ROAD REPAVING PROGRAM

The Village of Johnsburg will be resurfacing 3.3 miles of roads this year as a result of low pricing received through a combined bid pursued with the McHenry Township Road District. Peter Baker and Son submitted the lowest bid and was awarded the contract which includes the following roads: Miller Rd, Heather Ln, Aster & Indigo Ct., Dakota Ridge & Hiller Ridge, Fieldstone Way, Cove Ct., Knob Hill, Fairview Ave (south of Chapel Hill Road), Dolores Dr, Dennis Blvd, Grandview and Sudeenew Dr.

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# **Household Tips**

### 7 Tips to De-clutter Your Home

- 1. Be ruthless when deciding what to keep and what to let go of. It's the only way to succeed at de-cluttering.
- 2. Look at everything with fresh eyes. What made sense to hold onto five or ten years ago may not fit in with your lifestyle today.
- **3.** Every time you leave a room, take something with you that doesn't belong there and put it away.
- 4. Start off with small jobs. It could be getting a diaper bag organized so you're always good to go or clearing out a drawer or closet. Just keep picking small areas to work on and build momentum.
- Time for a de-clutter blitz. Once you've de-cluttered a few closets and drawers, you'll have some more room to work. You'll also have a good idea of how much time it takes. So pick a room, schedule a time and blitz it!
- **6.** Aim to have a place for everything and everything in its place. There are plenty of great storage products available.
- **7.** When sorting through your items, choose what makes sense to throw out, donate to charity, give away to friends or sell.

In connection with spring cleaning and decluttering, you may be wondering how to dispose of the excess garbage that may be generated.



Residents can contact the Village's waste hauler, Waste Management at 800-796-9696 to arrange for a special garbage pickup or you may purchase stickers to cover the cost to pick up garbage in excess of the 35 gallon limit included in the Village's contract. These stickers cover the cost of one additional 35 gallon can or bag of garbage. The cost for a sticker is \$3.20. Stickers are sold at the Village Hall and are also available at the Sunnyside Little Store, Angelo's and Novotny Sales.

Additionally, Waste Management is now picking up yard waste. The above referenced stickers can be used on a 35 gallon can or bag of yard waste as well, or residents can enroll in a yard waste subscription program by contacting Waste Management directly.

# **Household Tips**

One small drip can lead to another and before you know it, gallons of water may have silently leaked from your faucet or toilet without you knowing about it. Losing just one gallon of water a day due to a small leak equals 365 gallons a year. When you pay for your water, that leak can become very costly. Finding leaks and having them repaired not only saves you money in the long run, it also helps to preserve precious water. Here are some tips on what to look for:

- Turn off all faucets in the house including bathtubs, laundry sinks and outdoor faucets. Make sure the dishwasher and washing machine are not running. Turn off all other appliances that use water.
- Check the gauge on the water meter, if you have one, after you've turned off all the faucets and appliances that use water, to see if the arrow is rotating on the flow indicator. A moving arrow indicates there is a leak somewhere in your house and you should check for leaks.
- Go through the house and check the spouts of all the faucets for signs of a drip. Rub your finger under the spout to see if you can feel any water, even if the faucet is turned off. Look for puddles of water at the base of all the faucets. Check the shower heads to see if you notice water dripping.
- Take the lid off the tank at the back of the toilet. Squeeze a few drops of food coloring in the water tank. Wait 15 minutes, and look to see if the food coloring shows up in the toilet bowl. Seeing food coloring in the bowl would indicate water is leaking from the tank into the bowl even when the toilet isn't being flushed. Repeat this procedure with all the toilets in the house.
- Pull the refrigerator away from the wall and check the connecting water line if your refrigerator has an ice-maker. Look for puddles on the floor or water dripping from the water line.
- Pull the washing machine away from the wall and check the water supply line to the washer. Check for puddles under the washer.
- Check the valves on the hot water tank for signs of drips. Hissing sounds near the pipes or valves on the tank can also indicate a leak you wouldn't be able to see.


### MCHENRY AREA YOUTH COMMISSION SUMMER 2013 PROGRAM
