#### **PUBLIC WORKS NEWS – SNOW REMOVAL**

The Village of Johnsburg has a Snow Removal and Ice Control Policy in place to help insure safe roadways during inclement weather. As we prepare for winter weather, here are some things you should know:

- Hazards at the roadside, such as boulders or driveway markers that may interfere with or damage plows, must be removed before the first snowfall.
   In larger storms it can be difficult for our drivers to see the edge of the road.
- Major roads and bus routes are plowed first, followed by secondary subdivision streets and finally cul de sacs and private roads.
- Please adhere to the "No Parking" along the road on days when a 2 inch snowfall has occurred or is being forecasted.
- Check your mailbox post to make sure it is sturdy enough to withstand snow being deflected from the plow. We will repair mailboxes only if they come in direct contact with the snowplow and will not repair them if the force of the snow knocks them down.
- Make sure the area around your mailbox is shoveled so mail can be delivered and around any fire hydrant that may be on your property.
- · Increase the following distance when driving behind a snowplow. It is very difficult for the drivers to see cars directly behind them.

The program has built many positive relationships between police officers and the children of our community. The Officers and the children begin their early December evening by having dinner. Afterwards the true excitement begins. Each child receives a fixed amount to spend on Christmas gifts at our local Walmart store. This evening positively impacts the kids as well as the Johnsburg Police officers and Lion's Club volunteers.

Children are recommended for participation in the program by police department members, school employees, social agencies and family shelters. # **3rd Annual Citizen's Police Academy Class**

The Johnsburg Police Department has announced the 3rd annual Citizen's Police Academy Class. A Citizen Police Academy is a program intended to educate citizens about police work and is designed to give the public a working knowledge of our department's organization, personnel, policies and procedures. The Citizen Police Academy is not designed as a preparatory class for individuals who desire to become a law enforcement officer. Rather, it is intended as an educational and informative offering for adults who both reside or work within our village and have a desire to learn more about their police department. Enrolled students will be encouraged to build a lasting partnership with the Department, with the ultimate goal of reducing crime and improving the quality of life in our neighborhoods.

The Citizen Police Academy topics will include the history and evolution of law enforcement, firearms familiarization, patrol tactics, gangs, drug enforcement, special response team operations, canine patrol, criminal law, crime prevention, media relations, crime scene processing, investigations, and others.

The Academy begins on Tuesday, January 21, 2014 and will meet once per week for a total of 9 two to three hour sessions. A variety of instructors from the Johnsburg Police Department, and guests, will be presenting an assortment of topics in order to provide the public with a comprehensive view of police work and the criminal justice system.

The Academy is offered free of charge to Johnsburg Citizens and business owners. Anyone interested in applying for the Academy must complete an application which involves a criminal background check and must meet the following criteria:

- Must be 21 years old or older
- No prior felony conviction
- No outstanding warrants
- No pending criminal cases

### **JOHNSBURG RESCUE SQUAD**

In each issue of the Voice of Johnsburg, we strive to acknowledge the many generous hard working people that make our community a great place to call home. In this issue, I would like to reflect on the men and women who served on the Johnsburg Rescue Squad.

The Johnsburg Rescue Squad was the first volunteer rescue squad in McHenry County and the first chartered rescue squad in the State of Illinois. In 1952 a group of twelve men solicited donations to purchase the needed equipment to form the squad and by 1953 the rescue squad was officially organized. The founding members consisted of Clem Freund, Gerald Hettermann, Fred Huemann, Kenneth Hamsher, Lloyd Oeffling, Richard Marshall, Albert Adams, John Stone, Bill Schmitt, Joel Himpelmann, Gerald Wakitsch, and Harry Freund. The Johnsburg Rescue Squad at that time served the unincorporated areas throughout the County and the surrounding communities including Fox Lake, Spring Grove, McHenry and Richmond. Since that time more than 98 men and women served on the volunteer squad until 1990 when rescue services were taken over by the McHenry Township Fire Protection District. These committed men and women saved many lives and were there in times of medical need for many people. The building we see today that houses the Johnsburg Police Department originally was home to the Johnsburg Rescue Squad and was built by members of the squad back in 1960.

After the McHenry Township Fire Protection District began to provide services, members of the volunteer squad had a desire to stay involved with the community. Over the years they have donated much time and money towards improving the community to include scholarship donations to students pursuing a career in the medical field; the purchase of the Johnsburg Community Sign located by the library and furniture for the Johnsburg Public Library. They organized food drives every other month for the past six years and financed (at no interest) the Village's purchase of the old rescue squad building to house the Johnsburg Police Department. The retired rescue squad also donated \$15,000 to the Johnsburg Community Club to replace the club's roof and aid in the replacement of windows. Most recently they donated more than \$150,000 in improvements to park land owned by the Village next to the Johnsburg Community Club which has been named "Johnsburg Rescue Squad Memorial Park". The improvements include tree clearing; grading and the creation of a detention area; construction of a gazebo and sitting area; an asphalt parking lot with concrete curbing and sidewalks; landscaping (including shrubs and trees); and the purchase and installation a flagpole, monument, benches and signage. A formal dedication of the park is planned for next spring. We hope you will come out and join us for the dedication and honor the members of the Johnsburg volunteer Rescue Squad. ### **Johnsburg VFW**



The VFW traces its roots back to 1899 when veterans of the Spanish-American War (1898) and the Philippine Insurrection (1899-1902) founded local organizations to secure rights and benefits for their service. At that time, some of the veterans banded together and formed organizations that would later become

known as the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States. The VFW's mission is to "honor the dead by helping the living" through veterans' services, community service, national security and a strong national defense.

George Braun and his team of dedicated members of the Johnsburg VFW do an incredible job honoring our fallen veterans through the Memorial Day festivities they organize each year. We are very grateful to those who have served to protect the freedoms we enjoy today and we greatly appreciate all that the Johnsburg VFW does to honor our veterans.

The Armed Forces Flag Memorial located at the Johnsburg Community Club was an Eagle Scout project pursued several years ago by Nick Savitzky, a young man from our community. The project was supported by the Johnsburg VFW, Johnsburg Community Club and many generous resident contributions. It incorporates the flags of each armed service, the American flag, our state flag and the POW flag.

Recently, members of the Johnsburg VFW honored Bagpiper Gordon R. Crombie who passed away in September after a bout with cancer at the age of 75. They presented him with a Resolution of Appreciation and Affection which was delivered and read to Gordon the night before he died by his wife Kathryn. Mr. Crombie had traveled for many years to Johnsburg to participate in the Memorial Day ceremonies, patriotically influencing the atmosphere of the event. He performed at the opening ceremonies on the banks of the Fox River and then led the parade to the Johnsburg Community Center where he again played to set the patriotic tone for the culminating ceremonies at the Armed Services Flag and Military Honors Commemorative Brick Memorial. He performed in the presence of many elected officials and local military veterans. Mr. Crombie was truly talented and will be missed.
