Roundabout Nears Completion

FALL BRUSH PICKUP

The Johnsburg Public Works Department will be conducting its annual fall brush pickup beginning September 15, 2014. All brush must be placed by the road no later than 7:00 a.m. on Monday, the 15th of September. Crews will make one pass through each subdivision therefore any branches that are not placed by the road when they go by will not be picked up at a later time. Branches should be a minimum of 4 feet in length to be safely placed in the chipper and no greater than 6 inches in diameter. They must be placed with their cut ends pointed towards the road in a neat and orderly pile. Branches that cannot be put through the chipper safely will not be taken. Evergreen cuttings must be kept separate from other tree branches and will be picked up separately. This service is being provided for larger branches generated from trimming or storm damage and is not intended for disposal of whole trees that have been removed.

t publication of this issue we are preparing for the full intersection closure at Johnsburg Road and Chapel Hill Road to facilitate the completion of the roundabout construction. The improvements, which include the continuation of the streetscape enhancements constructed in the first phase of the project, are expected to be substantially complete by the beginning of September - weather permitting. Monitor our website and email notices for more information regarding the formal opening ceremony. Thank you to all of our residents and business owners for your patience and cooperation throughout the construction. By working together, we were able to minimize the construction impacts and will soon benefit from the enhancement to our community.

2014 Road Maintenance Program

Each year, the Village pursues a road resurfacing program with the use of Motor Fuel Tax (MFT) dollars it receives. Roads are resurfaced predicated upon a priority list developed upon annual inspections performed by the Public Works Director, Village Engineer and members of the Public Works Committee. Last year, the Village augmented the program with the use of General Fund revenues in order to pursue a five mile road resurfacing program – its largest ever. This year, at the recommendation of the Public Works Committee, the Village will be utilizing MFT dollars to pursue a Village wide road patching program to address potholes that resulted from this past year's harsh winter.

This year the Village also set aside some General Fund revenues to help residents patch private roads. This is a departure from past practices, but one that is greatly needed for safety purposes. Despite the maintenance efforts pursued by private road residents, many of these roadways have significantly deteriorated to the point of becoming nearly impassable at times. The Village continues to work with the residents on private roads to provide them opportunities to bring their roads up to Village standards so they may be fully maintained by the Village however skyrocketing paving costs has made this endeavor very challenging. To insure that emergency vehicles are able to access our residents in time of need, the Village Board agreed to provide assistance to residents on private roads. Upon completion of a cost benefit analysis, it was determined that the cost impact was minimal and the community benefit, significant.

Village Boat Launch Access

The elimination of vehicle stickers created the need for the Village to establish an alternative means of regulating the use of the Village's boat launch located on Riverview Drive. Use of launch will continue to be regulated through the purchase of stickers which are on sale at the Village Hall. The sticker cost for residents is \$20 and non-residents may purchase a sticker for \$100.

Optional Vehicle Stickers

Although the Village of Johnsburg no longer requires the use of vehicle stickers, we do have them available for residents who wish to display one. The two year sticker can be purchased at the Village Hall for a cost of \$20.






HONORING ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST CATHOLIC CHURCH

n June 29, 2014 the McHenry County Historical Society honored St. John's Church in recognition of its historic and architectural significance to Johnsburg and McHenry County. St. Johns received Landmark status from the McHenry County Historical Society in 1984 in recognition of the church's continuous standing at its location.

The church has served the community since 1842 however there have been several transitions during that time. The church was first built as a log structure in 1842 and was replaced three times since. The second structure was built in 1850 with the third built in 1868 but destroyed by a fire in 1900. Work on the fourth and current structure began shortly after the fire and was completed in 1902. In 1979, the parishioners celebrated the restoration of the church and have pursued several enhancements since. The stained glass windows have been restored and most



recently, a new copper roof was installed. While some of the improvements have aesthetically enhanced the church, many of the parishioners may express that the recent addition of air conditioning was one of the most welcomed improvements.
