Old Business	<p>Chapter 15 – 15.15 Operation of Non-Highway Vehicles / Chapter 8 – 8.03 Use of Park Areas (D) Motorized Vehicles. Chairman Frost discussed the operation and speed limit for motorized vehicles (non-highway permitted vehicles) be allowed on village parks and paths. Committee discussed potential hazards of associated speeds, potential safety concerns and impact to turf/grounds between UTVs and Golf Carts (Non-Highway permitted vehicles). Further discussion on how to enforce a speed limit if one was implemented, what evidence could be brought forward and who would enforce. Chairman Frost recommended a discussion with CAC – Parks & Facility to see if budget would allow dedicated paths in all parks and limit Non-Highway vehicle strictly to said paths.</p> <p>Chapter 12 Nuisances Committee members reviewed the new verbiage that was put in on section 12.06 Parking Motor homes and Mobile homes. Member Gebis expressed concerns limiting trailers, motorhomes, automobiles to a specific number of 4 is not fair across the board to the community as addressed concerns regarding number of children of age and family size. He reemphasized that this should be a restriction implemented via HOAs.
